On November 18, 1988 President Ronald Reagan signed P.L. 100-690, the Anti-Drug Abuse Act of 1988, which establishes a nationwide program to encourage the mass replication of recovery houses based upon the Oxford House Concept. The Kingdom House Recovery Ministry is an idea based on a sound system (Oxford House) for men that are recovering to help themselves.

Kingdom House is a self-help boarding house with accountability for recovering, as well as providing a missing link in the recovery process from alcoholism and drug addiction by helping to provide housing, fellowship, self-reliance and self-respect for recovering individuals. Kingdom House's primary goal is the provision of providing housing.

Kingdom House offers affordable housing for males that are employed and in need of housing. If you would like an opportunity to live in Kingdom House, please print and complete the standard application. Contact Deacon Maurice Southall to schedule an interview for eligibility. The cost is \$100 weekly for rent. If you are approved, a deposit of \$60 is due upon moving in.
